



New School Building Inaugurated at Parmal with Support from TDF USA Atlanta Chapter

Kamareddy District: A government school that was in a dilapidated condition at Parmal village in Lingampet Mandal, Kamareddy district, has received a new lease of life with the inauguration of a new school building. With the support of Telangana Development Forum USA (TDF USA) Atlanta Chapter, a new school building with four classrooms was inaugurated under the ??TDF ?? Mana Telangana Badi?• project.
